However, consensus in addressing mental health in schools has yet to be reached with limited uniformity in programs. Mental health

researchers have found that potential resources like school nurses are underused, under-recognized, with their role misunderstood. The purpose of this paper is to review the state of the science concerning school mental health programs and the role that school nurses could provide in mental health services to school age children. Methods included two search strategies using Scopus, PubMed and CINAHL investigated the role of school nurses in mental health and school mental health programs. A total of 32 articles were analyzed in an effort to clarify the role of the school nurse in mental health and how their success in this role can be facilitated. Results established that school mental health programs are successful, particularly those using a collaborative whole school approach ideal. However, schools must overcome barriers of funding and mental health team limitations. School nurses are highly capable of identifying, referring, intervening, and educating about mental health and can lead collaborative efforts in school mental health. Barriers to school nurses using their mental health skills include: lack of role clarity, resources, and education. Based on the literature review, it was concluded that school mental health programs need to collaborate with community resources and focus on identification, early intervention, as well as treatment in a culturally competent manner.
